Rochelle Groskreutz first spotted the shadow of an Easter Elf on her bedroom wall when she was nine years



HOP IN SHAPE!

IS WEAVING YOUR SPECIALTY, TOO? (Ask an adult to help with this craft)

What you need:

- scissors
- colored paper
- tape

What to do:






1. Cut several different colors of paper into one-inch strips (you will want about 10 strips total).



2. Fold another piece of colored paper in half. Starting at the fold, cut slits in the paper, each about an inch apart. Stop cutting an inch or so before the edge.



3. Unfold your paper. Starting at the top of your first long cut, weave a colored strip over and under your slits.



4. Repeat weaving until colored strips fill your entire paper.




5. Trim and tape the edges to keep your weaving in place.



6. Make a cool decoration, or have an adult laminate it into a placemat!


